DR. LAURIE L. MULVEY

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Dr. Laurie Mulvey is the Executive Director and Co-Founder of the World in Conversation Center for Public Diplomacy (WinC) at Penn State University. Under her leadership, WinC has become the largest university-based, cross-cultural dialogue center in the United States, hosting more than 3,000 peer-facilitated dialogues each year. Laurie and her staff at WinC also host peer-facilitated dialogues virtually with organizations and universities in Afghanistan, Pakistan, Iran, the Palestinian Territories, Israel, Kuwait, Qatar, China, Russia, Saudi Arabia, Northern Ireland, Iraq, Colombia, Cambodia, and twelve nations in the NATO Alliance. Laurie has also collaborated with the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), United Nations Alliance of Civilizations (UNAOC), and the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) to offer these cross-border dialogues. Through Laurie's efforts to train non-professionals to skillfully lead dialogues, she is making it possible for average citizens all around the globe to address legacies of conflict in their own communities. For this reason, Laurie and her collaborator (and husband), Sam Richards, have been called "the parents of radical empathy." Their shared work was featured in an Emmy award-winning documentary entitled, "You Can't Say That." Most recently, Laurie spearheaded and led an organization-wide research and development process that created a dialogue prototype that is both a structure and a process for the creative act of solving problems in the midst of divides—because, as Laurie says, "we can only solve problems within our conflicts, not outside of them. We will never be 'outside' of our conflicts."

Laurie is the author of *Making Peace Between Our Colors: The Inner Work (2008)*, and *Transforming Conflict and Collaboration: Essentials for Facilitated Dialogue* (2019), and is currently working on another book titled, *Systems of Conflict*.

ACADEMIC COURSES

Over the years, I learned that social science lectures and textbooks do not get "inside" us. Students hear what they expect to hear; and they confirm their beliefs and biases accordingly—even in the face of information that contradicts them. I observed that being in a traditional classroom setting did not alter the internal barriers to understanding something new or feeling something new. And I saw that learning requires room for emotions and perceptions, values and beliefs. So, introspection and immersion became central to my classes—because facts could not be addressed without also addressing meaning, nuance and interpretation. On top of all of that, I cannot know what each student brings into the classroom with them. So, we have to find the lessons together, in real time. As a result, my primary work as a teacher is to provide opportunities for learning (practicum) and then to be present for whatever is "alive" for students in the process. Through this, students learn how to facilitate communication, understand conflict and navigate group dynamics (as well as lots of other things) in the process.
